UPDATE

We were delighted that Anne-Sylvie, the President of our twin association in Loches, the Nouvelle Alliance Loches-St Andrews, was able to squeeze a St Andrews visit into her busy schedule during a business trip to Scotland earlier this month. During a friendly and productive meeting with several members of the committee a number of opportunities for the future were discussed. These included:

Walking/hill walking

There is a keen group in Loches and many enthusiastic walkers in and around St Andrews. There are plenty of good walks in the area around Loches and here the Fife Coastal Path might be a good starter – or even a few days of climbing Monroes. This might need a bit of organisation but a few of the known walkers in St Andrews will be contacted direct to test interest.

Sports

We have not been very successful in recent years. Anne-Sylvie mentioned that archery is very popular in Loches and some of the University archers will be contacted. The annual Silver Arrow contest could be a good focus fo an event in St Andrews.

Scottish Country Dancing

There are very enthusiastic groups in both towns. Anne-Sylvie is to check out the RSCDS website and then assess local interest in Loches.

Journee Europeenne 2018

This will take place in Loches during the weekend of 14/15 July. The small party, including St Andrews Rotarians and a few Alliance members, that visited Loches in July of this year, were very impressed by this event which is strongly supported by the EU (Travel expenses are paid). It is an event aimed principally at young people and we will try to interest the schools and the University to send some our youngsters – dancers, musicians, debaters – there are lots of possibilities.

Exhibitions

Anne-Sylvie should very shortly be confirming her booking of the Byre Theatre for an exhibition of pictures of Loches. If all goes ahead as expected, the Mayor of Loches, Marc Angenault will attend the opening and we hope that the Provost of Fife will also join us. Talks are progressing regarding exchanges of electronic images between the towns' Photographic Clubs with possible exhibitions to follow.
