Amongst these was the Mayor, Marc Angenault, and two members of his Cabinet, Deputy Mayor Valérie Gervès and Louis Toulet whose brief includes policing. They had a busy schedule, meeting the Rector of Madras, the Headmaster of St Leonards, the Community Police officer, Louise Fraser from BID with whom they discussed potential business partnerships, David Strachan Chair of the

Preservation Trust where they discussed common issues concerning conservation and preservation of heritage sites and Penelope Fraser, Chair of the Community Council. They also visited the new St Andrews West development where there is to be a road named 'Loches Drive' and were shown round by Pat Headon. All hope that from this will come not only new partnerships but also mutual understanding of common issues and ways of dealing with them.

The rest of the group had a less serious programme. They had a guided visit of St Andrews with Virginia Fowler, went putting on the Himalayas, attended a reception at the Town Hall followed by a tour of Holy Trinity and a concert with Callum McLeod and Lucienne Suter and friends. We were pleased to be able to contribute to the Rotary donation to Médecins sans Frontières, their chosen charity that day. In the evening there was a dinner at the New Club with traditional piping and wonderful Highland dancing by Joelle Millar. Our lochois guests also joined in a new Scottish Country Dance 'St Andrews to Loches' created specially for the occasion. Sunday saw many visiting St Andrews Hidden Gardens and in the evening, to round off the weekend there were pot luck suppers at the homes of three of the St Andrews hosts. All agreed that it had been an excellent weekend which fulfilled all hopes and expectations on both sides and we feel sure that the Lochois left (extremely early on Monday morning) with many happy memories.

We were very grateful to the Royal and Ancient Golf Club and to the St Andrews Common Good Fund who helped to support this visit.

In other news; earlier in the month we held our traditional 'French Day' at Craigtoun Park.
