TWINNING

The latest attempt to secure approval for the twinning of St Andrews with Loches started last October with the visit of Anne-Sylvie Vassenaix-Paxton, Marc Angenault (the mayor of Loches) and some of his colleagues.

The key event during that visit was a meeting with the Provost of Fife (Jim Leishman) to which I had invited Howard Greenwell, the Chair of our Community Council. The Provost made clear the support of Fife Council for twinning but emphasised that the decision to twin or not was for the local community.

As a direct outcome of this meeting, Dominique Robertson (from Fife Council) and I were invited to make a presentation to the Community Council at its meeting on 5th January. The presentation went very well and, as a consequence, Howard Greenwell launched a consultation through the pages of 'St Andrews in Focus' and the Citizen. All the responses to this consultation were positive and, at its meeting on 27th April, the Community Council voted in favour of twinning.

Now comes the bureaucratic bit! I met with Howard and Dominique on 6th May, just before they departed on holiday. I have drafted a Twinning Agreement along lines suggested by Dominique and we are due to discuss it on 10th June. When we have an agreed text, we shall have to share it with our friends in Loches prior to a probable signing date during the St Andrew's weekend here in St Andrews. A parallel signing in Loches is tentatively planned for Easter 2016. As soon as the details and timings are known, we will let you know.

All of those who have contributed to this result, and there are many, deserve our warmest thanks.

There will doubtless be a lot of festivity when the signing of the Twinning Agreement takes place.
