TWINNING

St Andrews is now twinned with Loches and all who took part in the festivities made last year's St Andrews weekend a very special and happy one.

The business of twinning is not yet finished however, since a parallel ceremony is scheduled to take place in Loches during the Easter weekend this year. Our friends in Loches chose the Easter weekend so that the twinning could form a central part of the "Foire de Pacques", a major annual event in the town. Scotland will be the key feature in this year's festivities, so the saltire flag will surely be even more in evidence than is normal for our visits to Loches.

Easter is early this year and travel may present us with some problems of both availability and prices so it is important to fix the numbers who will be travelling to Loches. A form is enclosed with this newsletter and intending travellers are asked to complete and return it as soon as possible and in any event no later than the closing date of Wednesday 20th January. Note that the Nouvelle Alliance is recommending that we travel to Loches on Thursday 24th March and leave on Tuesday 29th March so as to enjoy the long weekend to the full and avoid the worst of the travel problems.

Once the number of travellers is known we will try to make block bookings, most probably by air to Paris, Charles de Gaulle, and then by TGV to Tours, where a coach will be provided to take everyone the final 40 kilometers. If the TGV is fully booked we may have to take a coach all the way from Paris to Loches, which sounds a little trying, but at least the coach could be organised to ensure that there was no hanging around in the airport.

Loches is always a wonderful place to visit and, for the twinning, it looks as thought the Lochois will be pulling out all the stops and that, coupled with the usual warm hospitality, should make the Easter-tide visit memorable.

Our efforts must seek to build bridges with the Community Council and with all parts of our town – the University, schools, the Merchants' Association, Rotary and others – and then to help them to establish and maintain links with their opposite numbers in Loches. Quite a challenge for all of us.
